



Joint delclaration between IATC Germany and IATC Serbia regarding the use of Ultrasound anesthesia for educational purposes

1. International Anesthesia Teaching Center is an international organization that fosters transnational collaboration and the exchange of knowledge across borders in the field of pediatric anesthesiology, which provides transition countries with the opportunity to operate on European standards by making available modern anesthesia equipment for hospitals and training anesthesiologists in using these devices.
2. IATC Germany, represented by Dr. Markus Schily, will enable the use of medical device eZONO ultrasound for anesthesia: monitor eZONO 3000 (together with two transducers 12 MHz and 8 MHz respectively) and equipment cart EC5311, which will be placed at the University Children's Hospital, Trisova 10, 11000 Belgrade for the educational purposes.
3. IATC Serbia, represented by Prof. Dusica Simic, is responsible for the proper use and maintenance of the Ultrasound for anesthesia, which should be placed in anesthesia and intensive care department of above listed hospital.
4. The Ultrasound for anesthesia will be handed to Prof. Dusica Simic during the International Summer School of Pediatric Anesthesia from 20th to 21nd May 2011 in Belgrade, Serbia.
5. Recommendations for further development of the IATC initiative in Serbia:
 - Prof. Dusica Simic is advised to nominate two young motivated doctors in the University Children's Hospital, who would use the medical device on a regular basis.
 - IATC representatives in Serbia are strongly encouraged to further promote the safe anesthesia and safe surgery project, with focus on educating health professionals.
6. Department of anesthesia and intensive care of University Children's Hospital is required to report to IATC Germany on a monthly basis the frequency of the use of Ultrasound for anesthesia (for the first 100 cases) in order to guarantee fast response in problem solving. In case of non-use of the ultrasound, has IATC Germany the right to transfer it to another partner country.

7. IATC Serbia is required to inform IATC Germany regarding any damage, lose or other difficulties regarding the Ultrasound for anesthesia within one week of occurrence. Since IATC Serbia will be responsible for the device, we strongly recommend to have insurance coverage.

8. IATC Germany and involved persons in the project assume no liability risk involved in the use of Ultrasound for anesthesia.


